## Serving God By Serving Others

When it comes to serving God there's an excellent chance you won't be serving him alone. Serving others and meeting the needs of both believers and unbelievers is part of the Christian life.

Remember there are many who need help - the homeless, unemployed, elderly, and single parents to name a few, who can use our support. Sometimes they may need someone just to listen to their story. Other times they may need help with a meal and/or transportation.

Here is an example of a couple who saw the need, stepped out in faith and action to help the less fortunate and honor God.

My husband and I spent October and November in Florida. While there we visited some friends who are part of an outreach ministry that they founded in Ft. Myers.



In 2008, Ken and Mary approached the pastors at Abundant Grace Fellowship church with a proposal to setup a "Soup Kitchen" at the Church, for the homeless and needy. Later that year, The Harry Chapin Food Bank of Southwest Florida certified Abundant Grace Fellowship as a site to receive donated food. Mary, the pastors and volunteers of Abundant Grace Fellowship are still serving meals on Mondays and Wednesdays. Since 2008 they have served more than 37,000 meals.

Ken and Mary met many homeless men and women. It soon became apparent that there was a need for bicycles and bicycle repairs. These bikes not only provide transportation to and from the "soup kitchens", it also is a means to get to work and medical appointments.

As the Working Hands Bike Ministry grew it became apparent that Abundant Grace Fellowship Church was too small to accommodate it. The ministry was moved to a larger facility, City Gate Ministries, a non-denominational church whose mission is to reach out and spread the Gospel of Jesus Christ and the love of God. At City Gate there was room to store bicycles and setup a bicycle shop.

In 2010 Ken and Mary applied for and received their 501(c)3 status to better serve the community.

As of May 2016, Ken and his volunteers have donated more than 2,700 and repaired more than 800 bicycles to men, women, and children. In order to receive a bike, adults are required to volunteer 8 hours of service at any not-for-profit church or agency to receive a bicycle. Children receive bikes for free because Ken believes " every child should have a bicycle or tricycle".



In October 2016, 25 bicycles were donated to the Abuse Counseling Treatment Center so that children who awakened in a strange place would see something familiar to them.

In 2017 may you be blessed with insights and inspiration, graced with quiet moments of simplicity and reflection, be a source of strength to those around you, be supported by your loved ones when you need them and may you be blessed with peace.

### HAITI NEWS

I finally have received contact from Jeanne Moise, my dear friend in Haiti. Her husband is Pastor Paul Touloutte, Pastor of the Lutheran Church in Les Cayes, Haiti.

I first contacted Jeanne by email, right after the devastating news of hurricane Matthew. I received word back from her just within the past couple of weeks. She said that they have lost most all of their trees, many people are without homes and good water supplies, the need is very great, and they appreciate all our prayers, which continue to give them hope. The women in Maniche, who began their peanut business lost everything, but are hopeful to begin again.



God has a plan in all of this. Please continue to pray for Jeanne, and the people in

southern Haiti. The picture is of the Lutheran Church and school in Les Cayes, where we worship and do vacation bible school when I travel with the teams from First Trinity, Tonawanda. I know too that many of the churches built by various mission teams and churches in the area and on Ile A Veche are mostly destroyed, so the need is still great there.

- Philadelphia Zone is planning the retreat in September with "Rejoice Always" (1 Thess. 5:16:18) as the theme as we celebrate 65 years of retreats at Camp Pioneer. Jan Struck is the retreat speaker.
- **#6** The 2015-2017 Mission Goal of \$2,000,000 is within reach. \$73,109 was needed as of 3/10/2017.
- **#5** LWML Eastern District has 11 delegates for the 2017 LWML Convention in Albuquerque, NM. We are praying for Catt-Allegany and Niagara Zones to have willing delegates to complete our eligibility for 13 delegates.
- #4 LWML Eastern District will have a banner made by Dottie Buerger, Philadelphia Zone for the 2017 LWML Convention "Jesus Christ, Above All"
- #3 District Pastoral Counselor, Rev. Sean Walters; Allison Young YWR; and Joyce Anyango, new Heart-to-Heart Sister will represent the LWML Eastern District for the 2017 LWML Convention (along with your LWML Eastern District President and all the delegates).
- #2 LWML Eastern District has some exciting plans for the 75th Diamond Dazzle Parade to be held during the 2017 LWML Convention. And the . . .
- #1 item heard at the March 11, 2017 LWML Eastern District Board of Directors meeting was ..."Mission"
  - An extra \$60 was added to the meeting Mite collection for the over 80 times that the word "mission" (or derivative) was said during our meeting.

At Grace Lutheran, Hop Bottom PA, we collect unwanted or expired coupons and on a monthly bases we sort them and send them to a military family. This is not hard but time consuming. So the more ladies that can help sort and check for dates the quicker it goes. We try not to send any that are more than 3 months past their expiration date. That still gives them 3 months to use them. We have two families at a time and alternate so they get a box every other month. If anyone would like the list of how we sort them I can send a copy of the list and other information. We send them in a medium priority box so it costs a little over \$13.00 to send one box a month. June 21st begins the Summer season. It is also the Summer Solstice. I happened to be on the internet looking for information on how Christians celebrate the Summer Solstice. I found an article entitled "A Christian Celebrates the Summer Solstice": by Kathleen Quiring - "Looking at it from a Christian angle, I embrace the solstice as a time to celebrate God's extravagance, and to express gratitude for spiritual joy and clarity." May you enjoy the summer celebrating in God's goodness and light.

**Gospel Outreach** - The purpose of Gospel Outreach is to engage, encourage and equip women to share their faith in Jesus Christ, their loving Savior, with people of their communities and the world.



I was looking for some Gospel Outreach programs in the Buffalo, N.Y. area to share with you.

**Buffalo City Mission/Cornerstone Manor** - On April 22, 2017 the LWML Buffalo Zone held their Spring Mission Workshop. We had the privilege of having as our Guest Speaker Suzanne Cervi, Manager - Volunteers & Community Outreach from Buffalo City Mission/Cornerstone Manor. Cornerstone Manor was the recipient of a partial LWML Eastern District Grant in 2012 for women's exercise equipment.

The Buffalo City Mission/Cornerstone Manor's Mission Statement- "Providing 100 years of hope" .exists to meet the spiritual and practical needs of the poor through the demonstration of the love and preaching of the Gospel of Jesus Christ'. The history of their Gospel Outreach program is a wonderful lesson in how we treat our fellow human beings.

It was June 29, 1917 that baseball hero-turned evangelist Billy Sunday contributed \$8,400 to the Buffalo Evangelistic directing them to open a rescue mission to provide chapel services and meals. From that day to today there have been many changes - expanding services to include clothing and sheltering the homeless, opening a shelter and safe house for families victimized by fire, violence, and other crises, moving to new facilities, to the DREAM program, a transitional that provides a pathway to a stable life where individuals have the opportunity to build a better a better tomorrow. **Their website is buffalocitymission.org.** 

**Harvest House of Buffalo, N.Y**. - many of you will remember that at our 2014 LWML Eastern District Convention held in Buffalo, N.Y., Harvest House was the recipient of Gifts from the Heart for their baby ministry. Founded in 1993 by Gary and Linda Tatu. Gary was born and raised in Western New York, Linda is from Pittsburgh, Pa.

Harvest House was not a life-long dream. They were always faithful to God but after attending a retreat they were introduced to Jesus as a friend. Gary became very uncomfortable with the uneven distribution of wealth in the world. This was the beginning of a dramatic life-style change. The bible passage "Then Jesus, looking at him, loved him, and said to him, "One thing you lack: Go your way, sell whatever you have and give to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven; and come, take up the cross, and follow Me." Mark 10:21.

Gary and Linda after months of research, prayer and feeling God's loving had guiding them, sold their home in the suburbs and on April 12, 1993 purchased a derelict city church which is now Harvest House.

Their Mission Statement - "Founded in 1993, Harvest House breaks the barriers keeping people in poverty; facilitating workforce development, wellness, access to basic human needs and spiritual health in our community". Their website is harvesthouse.ws.

**Jericho Road Community Health Center** - "Providing opportunities for the under-served and marginalized to be healthy, educated, and whole in order to demonstrate the unconditional love of Jesus".

They provide medical care for the whole family, especially those with limited access to medical care - families in poverty, refugees and immigrants. Vive has a 30 year legacy of providing safe refuge. Vive assists those who wish to make a refugee claim in Canada or who are seeking asylum protection in the United States by providing safety, shelter, food and legal help. The PPB - Priscilla Project of Buffalo serves low income pregnant refugee women. **Their website is jrchc.org.** 

These are just a few outreach ministries within the Buffalo Zone. Would you email me some of the outreach ministries (with their website) in your zone? I would love to highlight them in THE LINK.

She is responsible to appoint various committee members to the Board of Directors. Signs all vouchers for payment of authorized expenditures. Keeps in communication with the Board to make sure all necessary decisions are being made. Visits, and helps promote the work of the LWML Zones. She also attends LWML National Board meetings when requested.

**Vice President Christian Life/Special Focus** - May perform the duties of the office of the President, in the absence or at the request of the President. Attends Executive Committee and Board of Directors meetings. Coordinator of the Christian Life/Special Focus Department. Responsible for issuing the membership charter to a new society; reports to the Executive Committee and Board of Directors, and other duties as set forth in the Leader's Manual.

**Vice President Gospel Outreach/Organizational Resources** - May perform the duties of the office of the President, in the absence or at the request of the President. Coordinates the Gospel Outreach/Organization Resources Department. Attends Executive Committee and Board of Directors meetings. Serves as Chairman of the Nominating Committee. Oversees the preparation of the convention manual with the assistance of the Vice President of Communication. Develops a list of eligible LWML members to serve in appointed positions to assist the President and performs other duties as set forth in the Leader's Manual.

**Treasurer** - Attends Executive Committee and Board of Directors meetings. Is bonded at the expense of the LWML District . Receive deposit slips and monthly report from the Financial Secretary; receive and deposit all money in a financial institution approved by the Executive Committee; keep an itemized account of all receipts and disbursements; make all payments as authorized; serve as chairman of the Budget Committee; serve as member of the Legacy of Love Committee; submit records for financial review annually; performs other duties as set forth in the Leader's Manual.

**Pastoral Counselor** - Attends Executive Committee and Board of Directors meetings. Serves the LWML District in an advisory capacity; attend all LWML District Conventions; attend the LWML National Convention as directed by the Executive Committee; submit articles to the Editor for publication in the Eastern District News-letter, submit a written report for the Convention manual; serve as the spiritual leader for the Board and Executive and help with services at retreat and convention when possible; and other duties as set forth in the Leader's Manual.

The Lutheran Women's Missionary League (LWML) welcomed 3,471 people with 850 as first timers to the LWML Convention in Albuquerque, New Mexico, June 22-25, 2017, under the theme "Jesus Christ Above All". The convention theme was based on Philippians 2:9.

Jesus Christ above all Delegates to the 37th Biennial Convention of the LWML adopted a \$2,075,000 mission goal for the 2017-2019 biennium. This goal, by the grace of God, will fund 22 mission grants as men and women respond in prayer and offerings during the next two years. Mitchel Schuessler, Southern Illinois District, Junior Pastoral Counselor. A new nominating committee was also elected.

Zion Lutheran Church Ladies Aid, Accident Maryland presented its first hand-made Quilt of Valor to Korean War Navy Veteran and longtime Accident resident, Mr. Harvey Gurney Kolb, honoring him for his military service to God & Country. The quilt presentation was held following Sunday services 8/13/17 at Zion Lutheran Church, Accident (MD) with friends, family and other veterans in attendance.

Mr. Kolb served 4 years in the Navy aboard two ships: the USS Putnam DD757 and the USS Leyte CV32. In his lifetime of service to community & church, Mr. Kolb has sewn 1,024 quilt tops for the Zion Ladies Aid who then make hand-made guilts for Garrett County charities.

Quilts of Valor is a new project taken on by the Zion Ladies Aid. A patriotic endeavor, the goal is to present an Americana style quilt to veterans. Zion's first Quilt of Valor ---- a rail fence pattern --- is made from donated materials. Pieced together by Ladies Aid members Lena Fratz & Margaret (Peggy) Close, machine quilted locally, then finished with hemming by Peggy Close & labeling by Carol Jean Edmiston.

The mission of Quilts of Valor is to cover service members and veterans touched by war with comforting and healing quilts. Quilts are not simply passed out to men and women who served their country; they are awarded in a special ceremony as a symbol of public thanks. Each quilt is different, but all are used to say "thanks" and provide comfort to the recipients.

Since 2003 LWML Eastern District has MISSIONS delivered canceled stamps to the Canadian Bible Society. From 2003-2017 over 1300 pounds of stamps have been given to the Canadian Bible Society.

The MAIN GOAL of the Bible Society is to work with other Bibles Societies (over 200 around the world) in getting the true WORD of GOD to as many people as possible in their own language. This is a "tremendous challenge but hopeful opportunity" in sharing the Gospel message!!

Stamps collected from across Canada are combined to create charity boxes and are sold @ \$10 to stamp collectors and vendors. The headquarters are blessed to have volunteers who sort and package the stamps for these boxes, as the collectors only want certain kinds of stamps -- regular or commemorative or foreign kind and

they cannot be damaged, thus the reason for 1/4 inch around the edge and on preferably white or light colored envelopes, as they sometimes soak them in water to remove stamp and don't want the stamps to get discolored from dye.

The revenue generated from the selling of these packages allows the headquarters to print Bibles and distribute them. In 2015-2016 the distribution was called, "Key to Freedom." The Bibles are printed in English and French and given to prisoners across Canada. 10 pounds of sold stamps equal approximately enough money for 5 Bibles to be distributed.
