For by grace you have been saved through faith. And this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God (Ephesians 2:8).

At this time of the year, our minds can focus on the brightly colored packages with shiny bows tucked neatly underneath the Christmas tree. We wonder, "What is in those packages that we see?" Regardless of our age, we all enjoy receiving Christmas gifts.

What is the best Christmas gift you have ever received? The best gift I was thinking of was not wrapped and waiting for me under the Christmas tree, but it was a Christmas gift, of sorts. My gift came a little before Christmas when my first child, a daughter, was born on December 2.

Even though my daughter was a wonderful gift, she was not the perfect gift. There is one gift that fits all sizes, all ages, all nationalities, all races. It is a gift we can all share. Once you have discovered this gift, you will not want to return it. That is why it is the perfect gift for everyone. My baby was not this perfect gift, but another baby was. That baby, that perfect gift, is Jesus.

Many do not think they need the gift of Jesus. Many ask, "At Christmas, why do we need to talk about a baby who was born over 2,000 years ago?" Romans 3:23–24 answers that question. That passage states, for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God, and are justified by his grace as a gift, through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus. Our sins separate us from God. To save us from the eternal death our sins cause, God sent Jesus, the perfect gift, to redeem us through His death and resurrection. 

On July 16, 2024, a tornado ripped through the downtown of the City of Rome, NY, and moved east causing massive damage to buildings, homes, trees, electrical wires and poles. We were stunned by the damage. We rarely, if ever, get tornado warnings much less an actual tornado. Many people were without power, some for days. My husband and I were spared damage as we live west of the city. Other family households were also spared. Many stores and businesses were directly hit. Two of our historic churches lost their steeples which crashed onto their roofs crushing the interior of the sanctuaries. St. Mary's Catholic Church was demolished and will be taken down. First Presbyterian Church was badly damaged but has been ruled as rebuildable. No-one was injured or killed. We were astounded by how quickly workers came from all over the state and other states to help with the power and cleanup after the storm. The Community of Schools and the Red Cross, among others, were out the next morning with breakfast and supplies for those who were left homeless. I imagine many folks felt hopeless as they toured the city and saw the destruction.

Our Retreat theme of "Abound in Hope" paves the way for so many who feel hopeless. May we pray for all those who have suffered from storms, disease and other maladies. We pray the words of verses taken from Psalm 42, an anthem of hope:

"As a deer longs for a stream of cool water, so I long for You, O God.

Why am I so sad? Why am I so troubled?

I will put my hope in God, and once again I will praise Him."

GENESEE ZONE JOINT MISSION PROJECT



On October 12, 100+ Hygiene Bags for the House of Mercy and the homeless of the City of Rochester were packed during a fun packing party held at Pinnacle Lutheran Church. This was the culmination of a joint project between Pinnacle Lutheran Church in Henrietta, NY, and St. Mark Lutheran Church in Mendon, NY, that was 4 months in the making.

The House of Mercy is a shelter for the homeless in Rochester, NY. They provide 3 meals per day, beds for up to 76 guests, and additional accommodations during times of "code blue". They work to help their guests find more permanent housing if needed and provide other social service support.

The project stemmed from an idea from Vicar Al Boezi of Pinnacle when he wanted to do a sandwich bag ministry for the homeless. When we learned that the House of Mercy can provide 3 meals per day, we asked them if hygiene bags would be helpful and the idea was well received. The backpacks included basic hygiene products (such as toothbrush, toothpaste, soap, shampoo, washcloth, razor, shave cream, deodorant, etc.), a deck of cards, note pad and pen, a snack, a gospel of John, and other devotional materials. In addition to completing the backpacks, we were able to purchase additional needs for the shelter including bed pads, flip flops, feminine hygiene products, men's and women's underwear, and masks. We had so many donations (which came in the form of "in kind" donations, cash donations, corporate donations, and Thrivent Action Teams) that we were able to also bring surplus items to a local food pantry and a local senior center. We also had items available for our churches to use for Operation Christmas Child shoe boxes.

The backpacks were delivered on October 17, by Vicar Al and Barbara McHenry. The staff and guests received us graciously and gave us a tour of the building. We were even gifted with a signed copy of a children's book that one of the guests had written during COVID. We received a follow-up letter that the guests were so excited and grateful for all the "goodies" in the backpack.

This project could not have been completed without the grace of God and the willingness of others to share of their own blessings. It was truly a privilege to work to meet both the physical and spiritual needs of those in our local community.

In a God moment it was clear to me that we need to take the next step. We helped build the school now let us work toward providing the type of support that Joel and Scarlet Holcombe have provided to Point of Grace Academy in Kenya.

God put an interesting opportunity before us. Scarlet and Joel don't have the bandwidth to add another mission project, however they offered to assist starting a similar effort for BEE Liberia. The hope is that in October, Scarlet can accompany me to Liberia on a vision trip to set up the organization for future trips to Liberia. Scarlet is also coming to Christ Memorial to present background information about starting up mission trips to Liberia. As you are well aware an endeavor of this scale requires prayers and support. Please pray for a successful launch and, if moved, providing support for this project.

We never know how God will use us in his plans. It may begin with a chance meeting at a church event or observing the magnificent work of ladies doing work to His glory.

I encourage you to continue in your fellowship with each other and being His hands and feet.

Blessings in the name of our risen Lord Jesus Christ.



NEWS FROM THE SPECIAL FOCUS COMMITTEE

My command is this: *Love each other as I have loved you.* John 15:12

How can your LWML Society or Zone serve others and reach out to those in need and show the love of Jesus to all? Alexa Wolf, Special Focus, co-chair shares one way her church, St. Paul Lutheran Church and School in Hilton, NY, did just that. Maybe this will encourage your LWML to reach out and serve as well.



Throughout the month of October, students and congregation members at St. Paul Lutheran Church and School in Hilton, NY partnered with a 5th grade school family (the Liotta family, originally from Asheville, NC) in a food drive as communities in NC lost a great deal as a result of hurricane Helene. Along with other organizations assisting, this food was directly brought to Asheville by the Liotta Family after it was collected in the areas of and around Hilton. It was then distributed to those helping the community recover. Families who experienced hurricane Helene in Asheville, NC were also provided with food from the food drive. An entire trailer was filled with food to be given to those who were hurting and in need.

During the month of November, St. Paul partnered with the Liotta family in a Christmas toy drive for families in need, who were unable to provide gifts for their children (many of these families lost their homes too). Students also created Christmas cards for the families. Julia Liotta coordinated the toy drive in this area for us with an organization in North Carolina (ABBCM) that was assisting the community and providing a large storage area for toys to be delivered to. Here, the toys were organized by age and type. Parents were then able to pick out the toys for their children and wrap them there.



This was an amazing blessing for them, as there still were many destroyed roads and stores. Also, people could not order online if they wanted to because they did not have a home with an address sadly. It started off with just a few places who were holding the toy drive. But as more people heard about the toy drive, more boxes were being filled. Surrounding businesses in the area as well as other churches, including another LCMS church, took large cardboard boxes to fill with toys until the Liotta family left for North Carolina to deliver the toys. Food and donations were also collected for those in need too. The estimated number in need was 3,500. By the end of the toy drive, there were more than enough toys for the community! On the Liotta's way to Asheville, they stopped in another part of North Carolina to deliver extra toys they had from their truck so others in need in that part could also receive toys to give to their children. They were met by those on ATVs and other off roading vehicles due to roads being washed out. All the families were able to receive Christmas gifts by Christmas Day too!

It was an amazing experience and blessing for all who participated in this to see the Lord working through the generosity and care for His people. He was able to use those who took part in the toy drive to help provide for those who were hurting and in need. This was a great reminder that the Lord continues to bless His children and how all can serve in any capacity through actively taking part in the task, praying, or listening to those in need first hand.



Missions

At Christ Memorial there has been an effort to see whether we can help support the OSW Schools of Liberia (**BEE Liberia**) through mission trips. I'm thankful that many attended the meeting with Scarlett Holcomb to discuss some of the nuances of mission trips. I wanted to share some information on developments as a result of the presentation in April.

The first item that was addressed was finding an organization name and claiming a domain on the Internet. I invite you to visit the website, Missions of Care (missionsofcare.org), where you can read about our mission and vision for this organization.

The next step was determining dates that were suitable to visit Liberia. Of main concern was not arriving during the rainy season and yet be there during the normal school year. So we have settled on the date of November 18th through the 25th for this trip. Our goal for the trip is to establish connections with people on the ground that we can trust, identify safe and reasonable housing for future trips, and determine whether volunteers will have safe food and water for future trips. In short, you could call this a vision trip or perhaps a reconnaissance trip.

If we can determine that volunteers can safely be onsite in the future, we can open up opportunities to serve the community in a number of ways. You could be working on a VBS program, perhaps teaching a class, help with maintenance or building in the community, or be part of a clinical group to treat the children and community. These are just a few opportunities that may arise in the future.

The school community is a place where the gospel message is truly needed. The efforts of hands and feet can make an impactful difference in the lives of that community.

I hope that you would prayerfully consider helping us with the cost of sending a team of four people for this initial visit to Liberia. We have been blessed by two donors each offering \$1000 matching gift challenges to assist in fundraising.

Above all please keep this mission effort in your prayers.



She is responsible for appointing various committee members to the Board of Directors. Signs all vouchers for payment of authorized expenditures. Keeps in communication with the Board to make sure all necessary decisions are being made. Visits and helps promote the work of the LWML Zones. She also attends LWML National Board meetings when requested.

Vice President Christian Life/Special Focus - May perform the duties of the office of the President, in the absence or at the request of the President. Attends Executive Committee and Board of Directors meetings. Coordinator of the Christian Life/Special Focus Department. Responsible for issuing the membership charter to a new society; reports to the Executive Committee and Board of Directors, and other duties as set forth in the Leader's Manual.

Vice President Gospel Outreach/Organizational Resources - May perform the duties of the office of the President, in the absence or at the request of the President. Coordinates the Gospel Outreach/Organization Resources Department. Attends Executive Committee and Board of Directors meetings. Serves as Chairman of the Nominating Committee. Oversees the preparation of the convention manual with the assistance of the Vice President of Communication. Develops a list of eligible LWML members to serve in appointed positions to assist the President and performs other duties as set forth in the Leader's Manual.

Treasurer - Attends Executive Committee and Board of Directors meetings. Is bonded at the expense of the LWML District. Receive deposit slips and monthly report from the Financial Secretary; receive and deposit all money in a financial institution approved by the Executive Committee; keep an itemized account of all receipts and disbursements; make all payments as authorized; serve as chairman of the Budget Committee; serve as member of the Legacy of Love Committee; submit records for financial review annually; performs other duties as set forth in the Leader's Manual.

Pastoral Counselor - Attends Executive Committee and Board of Directors meetings. Serves the LWML District in an advisory capacity; attend all LWML District Conventions; attend the LWML National Convention as directed by the Executive Committee; submit articles to the Editor for publication in the Eastern District Newsletter, submit a written report for the Convention manual; serve as the spiritual leader for the Board and Executive Committee and help with services at retreat and convention when possible; and other duties as set forth in the Leader's Manual.

All officers serve a four year term. Any LWML member may nominate a candidate for office. If you know of anyone that meets the criteria as set forth in the by-laws of the LWML Eastern District, who you have spoken to and has indicated that they would be interested, please let one of the nominating committee members know.

2024-2026 BIENNIIUM MISSION GRANT UPDATE

We are pleased to share that **GRANT 6** has been paid. **GRANT 6 for \$4,900** will fund the repair/replacement of the air conditioner unit in the Tiemann Chapel at Pinnacle Lutheran Church, Rochester, NY, which is used for different worship opportunities, including serving the Alpha Deaf Lutheran Church community. Requested by the Genesee Zone.

GRANT 7 will be paid shortly (when all the necessary paperwork, has been received) in the amount of \$3,550 to help fund the monthly "Lunch and Learn" program at Holy Cross Lutheran Church, Clarence NY. Requested by the Buffalo Zone.

GRANTS 3 and 5 were moved to the bottom of the list, according to our guidelines, since their projects were not ready to implement the projects.

We have paid out \$20,450 for Mission Grants so far this year (including the two above).

OUR TOTAL MISSION GRANT GOAL FOR THE LWML EASTERN DISTRICT IS \$33,989.53.


The June LWML National Convention in Omaha, NE, was wonderful and inspirational.
