I am requesting that **ALL** societies fill out a form even if nothing has changed in their subscriptions and return it to me **before the deadline of April 1, 2010.** This way I can confirm who is receiving Quarterlies and the number of Quarterlies they are receiving.

Decreases in LWML Quarterly subscriptions can be made only once a year, and the deadline to do that is April 1, 2010.

Societies are reminded to help defray the cost of the Quarterlies and ED LWML LINK newsletter expenses by sending contributions to their respective **ZONE TREASURERS**, who will, in turn, send them to the ED LWML Financial Secretary. If you haven't covered the cost of your Quarterlies for the current fiscal year (April 1, 2009 through March 31, 2010), please do so as soon as possible! Special thanks to all those societies who have been covering the cost of their Quarterly subscription costs and LINK contributions to date!

The Quarterly/LINK rates for the new fiscal year for the Eastern District LWML (April 1, 2010-March 31, 2011) will remain the same as last year: \$7.00 per subscription for 1-9 copies to same address; \$5.50 per subscription for 10 or more copies to same address. REFLECTIONS FROM 1ST TIME CONVENTION ATTENDEE JUNE SCHNEIDER

Greetings Dear Sisters in Christ!

My name is June Schneider. I am from St. Mark in Mendon. I hope my report gives you a sense of the special experience a LWML convention offers. I was given the opportunity to represent the Genesee Zone of Eastern District as a delegate at the 33rd Biennial LWML Convention held in Portland Oregon in June of 2009. I was one of about 530 delegates and about 3,300 total attendees, so there were lots of 'purple people' around Portland!

The theme of the convention was **Look to the hills God Reigns**, very appropriate for this location. There are "hills" all around the Portland area, since it is nestled between the Coast Mountains and the Cascade Range. The awesome Mt. Hood, actually a volcano, stands as a 11,000 foot sentinel east of the city. Mt. Hood is so majestic, but it is amazing that on some days, when the weather is hazy



or rainy or cloudy, the mountain seems to disappear. You can't see it, but you know it is there... Just as we don't see God with our eyes, but we know He is here!

The Bible verses selected for the convention were:

Psalm 121: 1-2 I lift my eyes to the hills - - where does my help come from? My help comes from the LORD, the Maker of heaven and earth. And , **Isaiah 52:7** How beautiful on the mountains are the feet of those who bring good news, who proclaim peace, who bring good tidings, who proclaim salvation, who say to Zion, "Your God reigns!"

The Keynote Speaker was Ruth Koch, a mental health educator and National Certified Counselor who is also an author and consultant who specializes in conflict management, grief and family relationships. Her speech was about "Climbing Mount Cambio", that is, Mount Change (Spanish translation). A brief summary of her talk on how to survive change follows:

Change is "just there", always a part of life; but it can be difficult to deal with, especially if you are "allergic to exertion" as Ruth Koch put it . So, with the help of fellow hikers (that is, our friends and family and fellow church members), and Christ as our guide, we can go from fear to anticipation as we climb our 'mountain of change'. You will come to realize that the view from the top is worth the hike. Remember that faith trumps fear, so when you do get to the top, dance!!! The view from the top can also give us a different, broader perspective. After we "summit", we still need to get back down the mountain. And this requires using different muscles (different coping skills, for example) than we used going up. Back at the bottom, we can experience an afterglow – a sense of peace, accomplishment, and gratitude to God for getting us through our ordeal!

In addition to the keynote speaker, there were many terrific presentations, sermons, and Bible studies. We heard from 2 young women missionaries, one serving in China and the other in Dominican Republic. A vicar who ministers to Native American tribes on the Olympic Peninsula in Washington State also spoke. This ministry is one of the fastest growing Lutheran churches in the Pacific Northwest and in the U.S. We heard a moving true personal story from motivational speaker Heidi Floyd, who is the ambassador for the Vera Bradley (yes, the purse company) Foundation for Breast Cancer Research, and is also a Lutheran pastor's wife. Dr. Mary Hilgendorf led a Bible study on the story of Ruth and Naomi from a female perspective. The "humorous interruptions" by motivational speaker and Christian humorist Jan Struck kept things light and lively!

Servant events were a big part of the convention. I was fortunate to participate in two of them: 1) highlighting key Bible verses in Spanish Bibles, and 2) helping to assemble Spanish Braille Bible book of Proverbs. Each attendee also was asked to bring a 'Gift from the Heart' with them, such as health kits or children's shirts, socks and school supplies, for Portland area charities.

The business part of the convention for delegates included voting on bylaw changes, election of officers, and voting on which of the 25 proposed grants would be funded for the next 2 years. A record \$1.8 million dollars from our "mighty mites" will fund 18 out of the possible 25 missions!

Another highlight for me was being able to attend a couple of special luncheons. One was hosted by the LWML President Jan Wendorf, for all the first-time convention attendees, like myself. Jan stressed the need for LWML societies to be adaptable so that younger women, who prefer shorter term projects and who have issues with attending set meetings, will be encouraged to participate. Another luncheon was hosted by the President of the Lutheran Church – Missouri Synod, Jerry Kieschnick, and his wife Terry.

In our spare time, we could browse the exhibits put on by various groups in the LC-MS, or even do some shopping at the Concordia Publishing House and LWML store booths!

The music and entertainment during the convention were excellent – the 125 member Pride of Portland 's acapella chorus was awesome! It was a special "hilltop" experience to participate in the opening and closing worship along with thousands of sisters (and brothers too) in Christ.

I learned some interesting things during the convention, one of which is the fact that the 3rd largest mission field in the world today in none other than the United States of America! I also learned that it took 40 years for the LWML to finally be given permission from the LC-MS to form in the year 1941! The church leaders were concerned about "who can control so many organized women?!" So we should not take for granted the opportunity to participate in our LWML organization!

I sincerely appreciate the opportunity I was given to be a delegate and to attend the National Convention. It was a motivational, inspirational, informative, and faith – building respite for me. I got the chance to meet caring and compassionate sisters from our Eastern District, and from Boston to Honolulu to Anchorage, and from around the world! I was impressed by the large number of seniors who were in attendance, even though many had physical difficulties. With God, all things are possible! I strongly encourage everyone who is able, to attend a LWML convention, be it the next Eastern District convention in Pittsburgh in 2010, or the next National Convention in Peoria IL in June 2011!

Another highlight at the Rally was an update on Lutheran Campus Ministry at the University of Buffalo which recently received their \$1500 grant from the Eastern District LWML. Present were Campus Pastor, Rev. Galen Purpura, Campus Commission Chairman, Rev. David Young and Peer Minister Kelly Wagner. They shared about the ministry on campus and thanked the LWML for their support.

Niagara Zone LWML will hold its Spring Gathering on Saturday, April 25 - hosted by Immanuel's Ladies Aid at Immanuel/Ridgewood time and program to be announced in the next issue of the LINK.

A few of our zone members are experiencing serious health issues, and we need to hold them up in prayer. Former District Parliamentarian Eleanor Senechal recently suffered a broken leg and is currently in Northgate Health Care Facility, 7264 Nash Rd., North Tonawanda, NY 14120


PITTSBURGH ZONE

FROM VP CHRISTIAN LIFE/HUMAN CARE **HOW CAN WE HELP OTHERS IN NEED?**

We learn the importance of helping others from reading in the Holy Book of James, Chapter 2, verses 14-17, "What good is it if a man claims to have faith but has no deeds? Can such faith save him? Suppose a brother or sister is without clothes and daily food. If one of you says to him, "Go, I wish you well; keep warm and well fed," but does nothing about his physical needs, what good is it? In the same way, faith by itself, if it is not accompanied by action, is dead."

As Christians we believe the Holy Spirit has come upon us and leads us with His explosive power to act as witnesses in our church, as well as "to the ends of the earth." In the Pittsburgh Zone at our spring rally I led our women to look at the work of the Lutheran World Relief with the making of guilts and the putting together of various kits. which includes sewing, layettes, school, and health items. After that presentations our women decided to see how many kits each society could make for our ingathering at our fall rally. On October 4th at our LWML Pittsburgh Fall Rally our zone's Human Care Chairman Annette Bowen and Alice Stofan counted all the kits brought for the ingathering. That tally included: 200 school kits, 120 health kits, 21 layette kits, and 7 sewing kits. All praise be to our Triune God!

As our LWML District's VP Christian Life/Human Care I am offering my services to any zone or society which would also like to learn more about putting together these kits, as well as to show the work of Lutheran World Relief with the DVDs I have been given as a spokesperson for them. I would appreciate an invitation from your group, so we can together act on fulfilling God's Great Commission, as stated in Acts 1:8, "But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth."

These items can be brought to any zone meeting and your zone president should be able to get them to the District.









He who was seated on the throne said, "I am making everything new!" Then he said, "Write this down, for these words are trustworthy and true." Revelation 21:5

"Lent" is an old word that means "spring." While many presume there is some kind of important theological meaning behind the term for one of the most impressive times of the church year, it simply means "spring!" While many of us in the district have been receiving weather that is anything but spring-like, the season of Lent does moves us forward to something special, something pleasant, something warm. death springs forth light, warmth and light. Jesus' resurrection from the dead is bringing new life to all. He is making all things new. This is help we can surely use in our lives.

Every day we must face the realities of the winter of sin. Our bodies fail. Relationships with those we wish to love with all our heart grow cold and die. Hopes become dissolved in despair. The heartbreak we experience from the failures and foibles of others is only outdone by the disappointment we feel from our own shortcomings.

Jesus is making everything new. He will replace our worn out earthly frames with glorified bodies in need of no pills, therapies, or aids of any kind. As we learn of His eternal love for us, we begin to find the ability to also love others and accept them as they are without making demands of our own. When all others fail us, we live in the warmth of Jesus' love that always surrounds us, always reassures us, always carries us forward to the new heaven and earth yet to come. Jesus brings springtime into our lives.

At the time of this writing I am facing the death of my fourteen year old yellow Labrador retriever, Newman. Newman came into our house as a six week old puppy before any of our four sons had arrived. Through the years I have affectionately called him my "firstborn!" He was there when my wife Linda was home alone for long periods of time. He was there to help urge our infant son David through his recovery from brain trauma. He was there to cheer us up when we were sad or bored. He was there to take us for walks through the woods, along the river, or just down the street. When the pills that help keep him going a little longer are gone, I will take Newman to the animal hospital for a final visit and he will be gone as well.

We can neither avoid the realities of this fallen world nor can we ignore them. They touch us all. Jesus helps us through. He promises to make all things new. I am sad that I will never see Newman again. It helps to know that the day is coming when I will be able to fluff, play, and stroll along with ALL the animals of God's new creation when Jesus comes again in his resurrected glory. It gets even better when I know that my father, who went to be with Jesus several years ago, can join me on my walk! Now THAT is what Jesus means when he says he is making all things new. That is what Lent prepares us for. That is the springtime Easter brings.

Things did not turn out the way I planned. I began attending a Pentecostal church at the insistence of my sister, and it was there that the Lord began poke me in the ribs, so to speak. What I learned from them was a certain passion for the Lord, and a passion for the faith, but I still didn't know what I believed, or why I believed it. I only knew that I did believe, and that I was being drawn to ministry.

After a year at Bronxville, my high school sweetheart also moved out to San Diego, and we began attending a Lutheran church together. It was there I began to understand the origins of the faith. I had never really even considered that faith could be founded on fact. The further I explored the more enamored I became. I had found the proverbial pot of gold at the end of the Rainbow.

In my 20 years of ministry I have watched with a mixture of curiosity and frustration the petty quarrels that often break out among siblings of the faith. A part of me just wants to laugh at the things we find to fight about, but another part of me; a far more passionate part, wants to scream, "Do you not know the wealth that you possess? Do you not understand the rich heritage that you have been blessed with? Can you not see the church bodies clamoring to obtain that with you have been given by heritage?" Why do you waste so much time bickering, while the harvest is growing every riper on the vine. For me the doctrine of the LC-MS is a pot of gold, surrounded by briars, and the LWML is an oasis among the thorns. Pray that the Lord of the harvest would send forth laborers into the harvest, to clear out the briers, that the gold of God's Kingdom may begin to shine, and that the LWML may play her part in the harvest.

In Genesis 31:48-50 Laban says to Jacob, "This heap is a witness between you and me today." That is why it was called Galeed. It was also called Mizpah, because he said, "May the LORD keep watch between you and me when we are away from each other. If you mistreat my daughters or if you take any wives besides my daughters, even though no one is with us, remember that God is a witness between you and me." Mizpah is a watchtower. It is a vantage point set high upon a hill from which one can see the surrounding countryside. It was a sort of early warning system, both of impending danger, and of apparent victory. What Laban said as a veiled threat, I say with great affection, Mizpah, "May the LORD keep watch between you and me when we are away from each other." May his Word and Sacraments be a rich reminder of the gold that lies at the end of our journey, that we may not be distracted by the things of this world, but rather join hands to sing praise to our King! Go for the Gold ladies, Go for the Gold!

2010 Eastern District 33rd Biennial Convention Highlights Pittsburgh, PA June 18-10, 2010

The Convention was attended by 62 delegates, 23 Board of Directors and 105 non-voting members.

The actions of the convention portrayed the message of our logo He being the Vine and brothers and sisters in Christ being the branches, gathering together for the purpose of fulfilling the challenges, goals and opportunities of this mission organization.

The opening service with Eastern District President, Rev. Dr. Chris Wicher, was inspiring and enlightening as we focused on the theme of the convention.

Pittsburgh City Council Woman Darlene Harris welcomed everyone to the city and gave a brief description of what the city has to offer in terms of medical care, theater and arts, restaurants, etc.

We also listened to guest speakers David and Kathy Ludwig, described themselves as ambassadors to the children; Pat Reichert, LWML National representative spoke of how she became involved in LWML and how our young women are our future and encouraged them to attend LWML; Captain Mark J. Schreiber, retired Chaplain gave a very touching talk on our mission to the military personnel and families; Barb Stuffer of Sonshine Ministries gave a very emotional talk on the mission ending with the fact that she is retiring from her position but will continue to volunteer in some capacity. She conveyed her appreciation of the in-gathering items that are well needed by those who benefit from the service they provide.

Reports were given by various officers and committee chairs giving evidence that our organization is thriving and fulfilling.

Thank you to those who helped in any aspect of the gathering of coupons, the assembling of cards, the ingathering of items for the Sonshine Community Ministries, canceled postage stamps for the Canadian Bible Society and those who participated in the Mite Walk.

MISSION GRANT GOAL OF \$24,40 APPROVED

Delegates to the Convention approved the adoption of a mission grant goal of \$24,400 for the 2010-2012 biennium. Nine grants were placed on the ballot for consideration. The delegates voted to fund the following seven grants in this order:

- \$5,000 for ministry outreach to spouses and families of deployed military personnel for Renewal and Reconnection Retreats at Pioneer Camp and Retreat Center—Joan Fritsch, Eden, NY
- \$5,000 to provide after school spiritual and educational materials for community outreach of Unity Lutheran Community Mission in Homewood, PA—Cynthia Barnes, Penn Hills, PA
- \$2,926.80 to provide worship furnishings and materials for new mission church called New Hope Lutheran Mission, Willingboro, New Jersey—Christ Assembly Lutheran Church, Philadelphia, PA
- 4. \$2,500 to purchase desks, blackboard and Bibles for a Christian school in Haiti—First Trinity Lutheran Church, Amherst, NY
- \$2,000 to provide equipment and resource materials such as visual Bibles for education inclusion ministry for the developmentally and physically disabled—St Mark Lutheran Church, Mendon, NY
- \$3,700 to provide learning materials to learn the English language, food, rice cookers and Bibles to the Mohawk Valley Burmese Refugee Center to help 50 refugees from Burma, Southeast Asia— Grace Lutheran Church, Canastota, NY
- 7. \$3,273.20 to provide television air time for Lutheran Ministries Media, Inc. in conjunction with Total Christian Television Network—St Paul Lutheran Church, Hilton, NY

Giving generously to your mites, and turning them in often will enable the grant recipients to receive their funding and carry out their missions. God bless all of you as you share His gifts with others!





The Richest Man in the World


When my family and I moved from Wisconsin to Pittsburgh some three years ago, I began to learn the proper pronunciation for some words associated with that area. I learned how to say such words as, "Monongahela." Not a small task! Along the "Mon" river, as it is often referred to, one can still see the remains of the great steel industry that once dominated life in Pittsburgh. One of the men chiefly involved in developing the steel mills of Pittsburgh was Andrew Carnegie (pronounced Car-NAY-gie). Mr. Carnegie came to America from Scotland as a laborer. Over time he got into the steel industry and focused his efforts there. Andrew Carnegie sold his steel interests to J.P. Morgan in 1901. In doing so, he became the richest man in the world. Not bad. Andrew Carnegie – the richest man in the world – was quoted as saying, "The man who dies rich dies disgraced." He put his money where his mouth was. He spent the rest

of his life distributing most of the wealth he had amassed by enriching the lives of others through libraries, education, cultural development and the like.

The story of Andrew Carnegie connects well with that of Jesus. Jesus is the richest man who ever lived, yet He spent His life giving of His riches to help others. Jesus had in His possession the universe and all that is in it. Yet as He died upon the cross He did so as the poorest man in the world. <u>Cell Phones, Pagers, PDAs, DVD Players, I-Pods, MP3 Players, Digital Cameras, Laptop Computers, and GPS Systems are also accepted.</u> Please place in a plastic bag. Include all cords, accessories and batteries if you have them. These aren't required, but are useful. These items do not necessarily have to be in working order.

Recently the LWML sent funds to five more of those mission projects in the amount of \$220,000. "Hooray and praise the Lord!" exclaims LWML Vice President of Gospel Outreach Marilyn McClure. The grants include:

- * Body and Soul Care for Children in India \$50,000
- LCMS Prison Ministry Provides Devotional Materials \$50,000
- Lutheran Braille Workers Provide English Braille Bibles-Africa \$50,000
- Mission Support to Disabled Children- Dominican Republic \$50,000

Funds in the amount of \$20,000 were dispersed to Na-

tive Leadership Scholarships for Students Enrolled in Ethic Immigrant Institute of Theology (EIIT). Since June 2009, the LWML has distributed \$710,750 for mission projects. Eight grants for the 2009 -2011 biennium have received full payment.

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
