



# "My Strength is My Weakness!"



At this time, during the season of Advent I thought it might be a good idea for us to focus in on Elizabeth, the wife of Zachariah, and the mother of John the Baptist. I thought it a good fit for the ladies of the LWML because there is much that I believe you may relate too. Elizabeth is only mentioned at one point in the Scriptures, and that is Luke chapter one. But there is much that we can gather from these few verses. To begin with she is described as upright and blameless, observing the Lord's commands, and well along in years. We know that she was burdened by social customs because she considered her status as a barren woman a disgrace and because of the seclusion she imposed upon herself for five months. The scriptures don't say why, but it is reasonable to assume that because of her age, no one would believe that she was actually pregnant until it was blatantly obvious. We also know


through her interaction with Mary that she was humble, "why am I so favored, that the mother of my Lord should come to me," and that she was bold enough to take charge when the situation warranted it, "No! He is to be called John!"

Elizabeth was an individual, just like each of you! She had her strengths and she had her weaknesses. Her humility, her virtue and her confidence worked in her favor, while her age, her infertility and social customs worked against her. She was just like you in many ways and yet unique. God of course would use all of these things together for good. God is not limited by our inadequacies, nor is He empowered by our strengths. In fact in the hands of God, our strengths can become shortfalls, and our weaknesses, assets. All of this we know, yet knowledge does not equal assent. Just because we know something doesn't mean that we can live it. We know that God loves us, and can empower us, yet we fumble about for fear of inadequacy. It doesn't make sense!

But then much of our humanity doesn't make sense. My point is simply this, if God can use Elizabeth, not to mention, Mary, Pricilla, Aquila, Lydia, Esther, Sarah and Ruth, then He can most certainly use you. I don't know exactly what God has planned, but I do know this, He isn't through with you yet! He has got a plan and **you** are a vital part of it! Abraham was 75 years old before he even got started, Sarah was 90 before she first conceived, Moses had a speech impediment, Paul a thorn in the flesh, Mathew was a tax collector, Peter was impetuous, Samson had a weakness for the ladies, and Jonah found it difficult to forgive. Yet God used them! So long as you have life and breath God can use you, and there is no better time to get started than this, the Season of Christmas and Epiphany.

If God thought enough of you, to send his Son to that manger in Bethlehem, to a life of service, and a shameful demise, then how could you think any less of yourselves? Advent is the season of hope and expectation, not only of the nativity, but also the second coming, and the resurrection of all flesh. Yet the world is full of those who do not know God's love. Full of those who would demean the church, mock our holidays, and bring shame the cross of Christ. These misguided souls should not be hated, but pitied above all. They do not know God's love; they despise the only one who can really help them. They need our prayers. This is the season to pray for them. Don't wait any longer. Don't count your weaknesses or even your strengths; they will let you down, just count on God's love. Seek God's direction and follow his prompting, and you will be an asset, to your community, your congregation, your denomination and the LWML. Well done my good and faithful servants.

#### **LWML QUARTERLY SUBSCRIPTIONS** NEW DEADLINE - MARCH 1. 2011!!!!

SOCIETY PRESIDENTS: It is that time of year again to review the number of LWML Quarterlies your society is receiving. In this edition of the LINK you will find a Subscription Order Form for subscribing to the LWML Quarterly. I am requesting that ALL societies fill out a form even if nothing has changed in their subscriptions and return it to me before the deadline of March 1, 2011. This way I can confirm who is receiving Quarterlies and the number of Quarterlies they are receiving.

Decreases in LWML Quarterly subscriptions can be made only once a year, and the deadline to do that is April 1, 2011.

Increases and changes of address can be made anytime during the year. You can mail a Subscription Order Form to Donna Coleman, 542 Burritt Road, Hilton, NY 14468 to make those changes.

Societies are reminded to help defray the cost of the Quarterlies and Eastern District LWML LINK newsletter expenses by sending contributions to their ZONE TREASURERS, who will, in turn, send them to the Eastern District Financial Secretary. If you haven't covered the cost of your Quarterlies for the current fiscal year (April 1, 2010 through March 31, 2011), please do so as soon as possible! Special thanks to all those societies who have been covering the cost of their Quarterly subscription costs and LINK contributions to date!

The LWML Quarterly/LINK rates for the new fiscal year (April 1, 2011-March 31, 2012) will have increased due to printing and publishing cost. The new rates will be: \$8.00 per subscription for 1-9 copies to same address; \$6.50 per subscription for 10 or more copies to same address. These figures include the cost of the Quarterly plus a \$1.50 contribution towards the cost of the ED LWML LINK newsletter, one copy of which is sent to Society presidents in care of the congregation unless the president has requested the LINK editor to mail it directly to her home. Society Presidents are asked to share the District LWML news with their members either by making copies available or posting a copy at church and also gleaning the LINK for news to include with church publications.

IMPORTANT FACT: These donations will enable the District to use your mite box offerings more effectively for mission grants; otherwise the Quarterly and LINK expenses must come from these receipts!

#### **BUS TO PEORIA**

As some may know, we as part of the Northeast Coalition are hosting the 2013 national convention in Pittsburgh in 2013 SOOOO.....we are hoping to get as many members from our district and the other districts in the coalition to attend the Peoria convention where we will be issuing the invitation for 2013. SOOOO.....there may be a bus going from our district going to the Peoria convention. We would be leaving very early on Wednesday, June 22<sup>nd</sup> 2011 and returning very, very early Monday, June 27<sup>th</sup> 2011.

This would be a one 12-hour day trip to Peoria. Pick up spots would Buffalo, NY and Erie, PA. (There is an Econolodge approximately 15 minutes from the Buffalo pick up spot right off Rt. 90 West Exit 56 for anyone interested in staying the night before.) Total cost round trip on a beautiful Grand Tours bus would be approximately \$135 with 45 people on the bus. If we get 55 people, the cost would be approximately \$120. This cost would not include the extra night's lodging in Peoria on Wednesday. Our bus would be used for shuttle service to the convention center in Peoria. If our district brings a bus, those on the bus get preferred advance housing registration. We will be changing drivers in Cleveland.







## "Gifted to Become"



There is much to be said for adoption, and those who chose to follow Christ's example by adopting children are a shining example of Christ's love to the rest of us. Tony Dungy for example, one time head coach of the Tampa Bay Buccaneers, and the Indianapolis Colts adopted a child (Jordan) with congenital insensitivity to pain. That may sound like a disease you would love to have but let me assure you, it isn't! For a child with no sensitivity to pain is prone to do himself great harm without ever knowing it. He could touch a fire, grab a hot pan, eat a hot cookie strait from the oven, scalding his mouth and know no reason to stop. He is no less prone to injury; it is only the pain that he fails to appreciate. What really makes this story remarkable though of his wife's (Lauren's) reaction? At her insistence they immediately went out and adopted another

child. According to his book "Quiet Strength," they assumed that they had been better equipped by God to care for Jordan's needs that others might have been. It was God's will and their privilege to serve. Likewise if William and Betty Victory had not chosen to adopt a little girl in 1960, I would have never come to know my wife.

But the real example is not Tony Dungy, nor my in-laws, but Jesus Christ. John14:18-21 puts it this way, "I will not leave you as orphans; I will come to you. Before long, the world will not see me anymore, but you will see me. Because I live, you also will live. On that day you will realize that I am in my Father, and you are in me, and I am in you. Whoever has my commands and obeys them, he is the one who loves me. He who loves me will be loved by my Father, and I too will love him and show myself to him." In short, you have been adopted by the Holy Trinity, you have not been abandoned. Your sin has been forgiven; your debt has been paid. Your Father is wealthy, so there is no need to worry about food or clothing, about education or health care or funding a wedding. There is nothing you will ever need that he cannot and will not gladly provide. You have no need to work for a living; your real need is to serve your Father!

Hence you too have been especially gifted to serve God's purpose. But our gifts like our sins can often be hidden. We don't always recognize for what they are. Occasionally that which we think is a problem is actually our greatest asset. You see in order to discover our greatest potential we must be willing to be stretched and molded and bent in ways we are not exactly accustomed to. I must confess that as a pastor one of my greatest challenges is getting people to appreciate the enormity of this simple phrase, "Because I live, you also will live." As a child of God there is nothing whatsoever that is possible for God (shy of actually becoming God) that is not also possible for you. It's not a question of what can be done; the only question is what are you willing to do? The LWML has been granted a challenge, and that is to empower the women of the Lutheran church to discover their gifts and serve their God. So forget about your limitations, and focus your energies on enhancing your abilities. The question should not be what am I comfortable with, be rather what was God gifted me to become. Amen!

sometimes needs to happen. I believe that we grow with change and it gives God the opportunity to use us in different ways so that we can experience more.


As district president I have the great opportunity to see and learn from all of you. As I receive some of your zone minutes I read how you are changing and also as I visit others I get to experience those changes as well.

This month my article has a simple and straightforward message. Keep Praying! From time to time it is good to repeat this and be reminded. Why? *Because we as fallen creatures are naturally adverse to prayer.* It takes time away from what we might rather be doing, even if that means doing nothing at all! Some try to solve this problem by multi-tasking prayer. They pray while they drive, exercise, or do other activities. This is certainly possible and often it can be a good thing, but it is only recommended as a supplement to prayer away from the distractions of the world and in the quietness of the heart. "Be *still*, and know that I am God." Ps. 46:10 Plus, I encourage you *not* to fold your hands, bow your head and close your eyes while driving on the parkway! Prayer is also hard work, and how often the path of least resistance is preferred. In

prayer, we place the needs of others before our own desires, and isn't that one of the hardest things of all?

The family of God requires constant prayer and it cannot survive without it. Anyone who wants to see the work of the LWML do well is first directed to pray that God bless it with the Holy Spirit and all the gifts He brings.





### Enabling the Blind to See Jesus—by Karen Klien

Thirty dedicated volunteers meet weekly at Immanuel Lutheran Church parish hall in Scranton, Pennsylvania to fill the great need of having the Word of God available to the blind and the visually impaired throughout the world. One group works on Monday evenings and the other group on Tuesday mornings. Immanuel's volunteers alternate weekly on making Volume 1 and Volume 2 of

Isaiah which are two of the thirty-seven volumes that compose one Braille or Large Print Bible.

This group gathers at one out of one hundred eightynine work centers in Canada and United States that assist the mission of Lutheran



Braille Workers, Inc. in Yucaipa, California that provides the message of salvation through faith in Jesus Christ to individuals who are blind or visually impaired throughout the world. Braille materials that are distributed through Lutheran Braille Workers are in thirty languages and are dispersed in over one hundred thirty countries. Volunteers produce each book by punching holes, numbering pages, collating pages, placing them on the zinc plates, putting them through the press and binding the pages. Then, they audit the materials, pack the books, and ship them throughout the world from the local post office. Volunteers range in ages from twelve to nine-two years old. On 8-14-11, Immanuel Braille workers hosted a brunch as a fundraiser for Lutheran Braille Workers, Inc. which serves 160 million vision impaired people.
