

God with us!

Matthew 1:20-23— But as he considered these things, behold, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream, saying, "Joseph, son of David, do not fear to take Mary as your wife, for that which is conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. She will bear a son, and you shall call his name Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins." All this took place to fulfill what the Lord had spoken by the prophet: "Behold, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and they shall call his name Immanuel"(which means, God with us).

The clock keeps ticking and here we go again, Christmas is coming, and Advent is here, the beginning of the new theological year, Joseph's judgment, Zechariah's guandary, the birth of John the Baptist, he leapt in the

womb, the three kings, Caesar's tax, the journey, the manager, the shepherds, Jesus' birth. This is a time to anticipate, to hope, to take courage, to rejoice, because God is with us! That is the point of our text!

Consider the rollercoaster Joseph must have been on. First a marriage had been arranged. The relationship was only beginning to be formed. The home was being made ready for two with a family soon to follow. His family and his friends were prepared to celebrate. It wasn't exactly a secret any more. The papers had already been signed; the contract was already binding. The only thing that had not yet happened was for the marriage to be consummated. Then suddenly Joseph discovered that Mary was already pregnant. That may not be such a big deal in the year 2013, but in the first century, was more like the Amish community in the seventeen hundreds. A lesser man, filled with rage, would have simply exposed her to public disgrace and let the chips fall where they may, but Joseph, being a righteous and compassionate man, sought to protect her from public disgrace and had in mind to divorce her quietly.

It was the Holy Spirit who entered in, "She will bear a son, and you shall call his name Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins." That which appeared to be the greatest of sins was actually an answer to prayer, the fulfillment of prophesy, the result of God's Promise, "Behold, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and they shall call his name Immanuel" (which means, God with us). Jesus was to be born that we might be redeemed, set right with God, forgiven of sin.

But that's all just the beginning, Advent is to be followed by, Christmas, and Epiphany to give Easter meaning, the Transfiguration to reveal His identity, Lent to set the stage, Easter that God and man might be reunited, and Pentecost that the hunt for God children might continue on. That is what the Lutheran Woman's Missionary League is all about. Mission! Being sent out to preach, teach, and proclaim the gospel! Primarily we gather to make missions possible, to support missionaries and their families. If it were not for the LWML many missions would not be possible, and if it were not for those missions, many families would not be redeemed. You did not redeem them, but you did facilitate the work of the Holy Spirit. It is all that God asks!







SCARVES FOR HAITI







SUMMER LUNCH PROGRAM 2012-2014 GRANT RECIPIENT

The last dozen eggs have been packed; the last gallon of milk has been loaded into a waiting vehicle. The final bags of groceries have been eagerly anticipated by hungry children. The 2014 Summer Lunchbox Program is now complete.

The program is basic: a flyer outlining the program is prepared for distribution through the local schools toward the end of the school year. The criteria for need is simple: If a child or children receive free or reduced-price meals at school, then they are eligible for the Summer Lunchbox Program. The flyer provides details of the program and contact information for sign up. The amount of food distributed is based on the number and ages of children in the household. That is, a family unit with 4 teenagers receives different amounts of food than a household with 2 pre-schoolers in it. Every effort is made to keep information confidential. The majority of recipients are from our local school district; however, we make every effort to accommodate the needy of surrounding areas if requested. The Program has grown over the past few years; we served 41+ families this year with a combined total of over 110 children.

In the past, food was distributed from our vacant parsonage. This year, the Fellowship Hall was utilized for food storage and distribution. Distributions are made bi-weekly during the course of the summer; this year we had 5. We double food quantities on the last one in order to keep hungry mouths fed prior to the resumption of school. A member of the Program places a reminder call to each household the Friday night before Saturday morning distribution as a reminder that wholesome, nutritious foodstuffs


await the family. A suggested pick-up time is offered, somewhere between 8 and 10 am in order to provide efficient traffic flow in our Hall. Volunteers help carry and pack the groceries for the recipients. Some volunteers are children themselves and their assistance provides a learning experience for them.

You may be asking what kinds of food are provided by this all-volunteer, grass-roots effort. We attempt to supply wholesome nutritious foods that are the best buy for our donated dollars. We shop local markets, "dollar" stores, discount food outlets (such as Aldi's), etc. The sites may change from one distribution to the next, but we are always looking for the best, nutritious foods we can find for the monies available. For example, we attempt to purchase low-sugar, whole-grain cereals, quality juices, etc. We are most grateful to area gardeners who shared fresh vegetables from the bounty of their plots. We have had several people who raise chickens donate "brown" eggs, a real hit.

For the first time this summer we contacted area churches, Scout groups and other organizations requesting donations of a specific food item. We were hoping to stretch our food dollars even further with the help of others. Grace Lutheran Church responded generously to our request with well over 600 cans of water-packed tuna fish. Another church gave us numerous jars of peanut butter. A Scout group contributed boxes of mac-n-cheese dinners. Still other individuals, knowing of our Program, donated items such as granola bars. The list goes on.

We also raise money through fund raisers to help keep our expenses to a minimum.

In closing, I thank you again for your generosity for supporting our program through your Mission Grants. Please continue to keep this program in your thoughts and prayers.
